You will notice a significant change in the numbers for SFYs 2020-2021 and 2021-2022. More than half of the DV programs are continuing to shelter and provide services within hotels/motels due to the Coronavirus pandemic. Only a few have relocated back to their shelters and operating at 100% capacity. The service contacts were conducted by the Hybrid Model (face to face/virtually).
