
UNMARRIED BIRTHS BY FEDERAL POVERTY LEVEL IN S.C.




UNMARRIED BIRTHS BY EDUCATION LEVEL

PATERNITY AFFECTS EVERY CHILD THAT IS BORN TO UNMARRIED PARENTS:

- ✓ If paternity is established there is a legal relationship between father and child, and child is afforded all the same benefits/rights as being born to a married couple.
- ✓ Research shows that when fathers are involved with their children they have:

- Less criminal involvement
- Less behavioral problems and acting out
- Less drug usage
- Less teenage pregnancy
- Improved school successes and a greater likelihood to graduate from high school



CHILDREN WHO GROW UP WITH INVOLVED FATHERS ARE:

- 39%** More likely to earn mostly A's in school
- 45%** Less likely to repeat a grade
- 60%** Less likely to be suspended or expelled from school
- 2X** As likely to go to college and find stable employment after high school
- 75%** Less likely to have a teen birth
- 80%** Less likely to spend time in jail
