What is SNAP?



SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program)

Provides low-income households with nutrition assistance by increasing the household's food purchasing power.

Who can benefit?

You may be able to get SNAP benefits if you are:

- Homeless
- Unemployed
- Elderly or disabled and are low-income
- Receiving welfare or other public assistance payments
- Working for low wages or working part-time

When is it available?

Qualified applicants for SNAP will receive benefits no later than 30 days from the date they applied. Some families and individuals may qualify for expedited services and will receive benefits no later than 7 days from the date they applied.

How much SNAP benefits will I receive?

If your household passes the program's eligibility tests, the amount of SNAP benefits you get will depend on the number of people in your household and how much monthly income is left after certain expenses are deducted.
