Workforce Impact: Owning our building will allow BBLS to increase programming and collaborative partnerships. In doing so, we will be able to teach life skills and job skills to more individuals with intellectual disabilities. This also will allow BBLS to create additional community partnerships and inclusive employment opportunities, thus creating a positive impact on South Carolina's workforce. We believe our high quality, inclusive life skills program for adults with intellectual disabilities will help to improve these outcomes in South Carolina. Impact on Special Needs Families: Having our own facility will give BBLS and its families a home. This home will continue to serve as a center and safe space for the community. Being an underserved population, adults with intellectual disabilities and their caregivers often lack a space within their communities that is welcoming, engaging, inclusive, and supportive. We will be able to continue serving both our "Teammates" with disabilities and their caregivers. This, in turn, will lead to improved mental health, physical health, and overall quality of life for the families we serve and will continue to serve.

Community Impact: Having our own facility also will provide a "hub" within the Tri-County area for local, collaborative partnerships. We will be able to host other businesses and organizations, making connections and establishing additional opportunities. These opportunities connect employers to potential employees and volunteers, which aids these organizations in meeting diversity and equity standards while also spreading our mission of inclusion and self-advocacy. This is absolutely a "win win" for the adults with intellectual disabilities in the Beyond BASIC program, local businesses, and community as a whole.
