

<u>Educational Support</u>—469 youth received education services totaling \$298,407 in the following categories:

- o tutorial services, summer school and adult education;
- senior items, such as graduation invitations and packets, SAT/ACT fees and college application fees;
- o computers for post-secondary education programs
- special recognition, such as attendance at youth conferences, ROTC and/or school related sports uniforms and equipment, honor/award travel expenses, governor's school tuition, and/or conference presentations; and
- o transportation assistance to school to complete GED or to college or vocational school.

<u>Post-Secondary Education Services</u>—133 youth received services totaling \$501,006 in the following categories:

- Education and Training Voucher (ETV) Assistance for post-secondary education programs, including college tuition, deposits, room and board, books, lab and equipment fees, and parking fees.
- Chafee Assistance for vocational training.

Interim College housing assistance totaled almost \$4,875 to help 2 youth.

Employment support services were also provided to 397 youth, for a total of \$124,990

Program partners provided additional educational and employment support services.
